#### WVRA: CHANGING LIVES THROUGH READING

In 1968, we started a reading (R)evolution as the first professional organization in our state dedicated to improving reading education. Then and now, WVRA members have consistently demonstrated a strong commitment to encouraging and supporting all West Virginia readers. More than 50 years later, we remain confident, committed, and caring West Virginians who are dedicated to the importance of reading and literacy.

#### **CONFERENCE OVERVIEW**

This year, the conference will celebrate and embrace the transformational nature of literacy. The conference theme is "*Literacy: A Joyful Transformation*" and reflects the amazing power that literacy offers, including the potential to spark imagination, inspiration, and wonder. The conference will present sessions and speakers that demonstrate and align with the following strands:

- > Strand I: Joy, how can we bring joy into reading and literacy instruction?
  - How are you intentionally placing joy at the heart of your reading and literacy curriculum?
- > Strand II: Transformation, how has literature transformed your classroom?
  - How have you used young adult and children's literature to promote happiness, empathy, and joy?
- > Strand III: Happiness, how has writing experiences and instruction brought forth tools that promote happiness?
  - For students and teachers, how has writing became a time of celebration and time to cherish?
- > Strand IV: A joyful transformation, how are you designing and delivering reading and literacy instruction that embraces and supports all learners?

#### PROPOSAL EVALUATION CRITERIA

- > Strongly connects to the conference theme: Literacy: A Joyful Transformation
- ➤ Aligns and identifies with a conference strand:
  - O Strand 1 proposals should focus on the joyful nature of effective reading and literacy instruction. Sessions in this strand include helping students develop a joyful reading relationship and mindset. Encouraged in this strand include cross-curricular and content-area reading and writing instruction and experiences that create wonderous moments in the classroom.
  - O Strand II proposals seek submissions that present the purposeful integration of high-quality children's and young adult literature to promote happiness, empathy, and joy. Powerful classroom narratives that tell stories of the impact of influential children's and young adult literature are encouraged to be shared as well. Submissions may also focus on finding the joy in choice of reading and the reading spaces/opportunities that ignite wonder and curiosity.
  - Strand III proposals request submissions that present how writing experiences and
    instruction can be powerful tools in the classroom, including a time of celebration and
    happiness. This strand will also focus on and include the joyful influence of effective
    writing instruction and the writing process.
  - Strand IV submissions should focus on reading, writing, and literacy instruction that
    embraces and celebrates all learners. Submissions may include research into practice
    and powerful school to home relationships that support and celebrate reading
    achievement.
- ➤ Targets a PreK-Grade 12 level/levels
- Excluded from selection are (1) incomplete proposals, and/or (2) proposals that promote commercial materials, programs, and/or professional consultants.

- > THE DEADLINE FOR SUBMITTING PROPOSALS IS AUGUST 1, 2022.
- Notification of a proposal's acceptance will be e-mailed to the author by September 1, 2022.
- All program presenters must register for the conference and pay conference fees by October 16, 2022.
