


The meeting rooms are divided into three major areas: Upper Bunker Rooms, Bunker Level and Eisenhower Parlors.















#### VISUAL DIRECTIONS-FLOOR PLAN

#### Thursday, November 16 Melody Pittman, 100 Things to Do in West Virginia Before You Die

Melody Pittman is a travel writer and influencer at Wherever I May Roam Blog, an MSN syndicated travel site that reaches nearly 4 million readers. She co-owns (with her daughter) a second blog, Travel the South Bloggers, and they also host an annual travel conference, Southern Travelers Explore. Melody freelances for several online and print publications, and this spring, published her first book, part of a national book series from Reedy Press, co-authored with a longtime friend since 6th grade, Angie Richards.

Melody spent 44 glorious years living and raising her family in Charleston. She currently resides in Mesquite, Nevada, but spent 4 months this summer traveling around the state of

West Virginia promoting her book and getting WV content for the future.

Melody loves finding lesser-known towns and gems on her travels and sharing them with her social followers. She is a firm believer in buying and eating local, and loves living history, road trips, animals, cruising, and meeting people.





### Friday, November 17 Mark Harshman, *Following the Silence*

Marc Harshman's WOMAN IN RED ANORAK (Lynx House/University of Washington) won the Blue Lynx Prize. His fourteenth children's book, FALLINGWATER; THE BUILDING OF FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT'S MASTERPIECE, co-authored with Anna Smucker, was published by Roaring Brook/Macmillan and named an Amazon Book of the Month, as well as a Junior Library Guild selection. He is co-winner of the 2019 Allen Ginsberg Poetry Award and his poem, "Dispatch from the Mountain State," was printed in the 2020 Thanksgiving edition of the *The New York Times*. His most recent publication is DARK HILLS OF HOME, Monongahela Books, 2022. His

newest full-length collection, FOLLOWING THE SILENCE, is forthcoming from Press 53. He holds degrees from Bethany College, Yale Divinity School, and the University of Pittsburgh. Appointed in 2012, he is the seventh poet laureate of West Virginia.

Of an earlier collection Jim Daniels wrote: "Harshman knows these people, these places, and he has the wisdom of someone who knows when to be quiet, when to watch, and listen, so that he can come to us and tell these heart-felt stories. These poems earn their keep, weaving together the physical and spiritual worlds in a landscape that can both sustain us and break our hearts."




**Dr. Carla Warren** serves as the Officer for the Division of Academic Support and Educator Development at the West Virginia Department of Education (WVDE). Her background includes 20 years as an elementary classroom teacher and more than a decade supporting pre-service teachers, teacher induction, and National Board Certification. Dr. Warren leads PK-12 academics, educator certification, and educator preparation which includes multiple pathways into the profession to meet the need for high quality educators in the classroom.

Under her leadership, West Virginia became the second state in the nation to register the K-12 teaching occupation as a Registered Apprenticeship Program with the U.S. Department of Labor supporting the launch of the Grow Your Own WV Pathway to Teaching and the WV Apprenticeship Model, innovative initiatives designed to remove barriers for high school students interested in pursuing a career in education. A native West Virginian, Dr. Warren is a passionate supporter of teachers at every stage of the teacher lifecycle and the work they do every day in the trenches to advance the lives of the students in our state.

**Lester Laminack**, Professor Emeritus, Western Carolina University in Cullowhee, North Carolina is a full-time writer and consultant working with schools throughout the United States and abroad. He is the author of over 25 books for teachers and children. His academic publications include Climb Inside a Poem (Heinemann) Cracking Open the Author's Craft (Scholastic), Bullying Hurts: Teaching Kindness Through Read Aloud and Guided

Conversations (Heinemann), The Writing Teacher's



Heidi Anne E. Mesmer, Ph.D., is a
Professor in Literacy in the School of
Education at Virginia Tech. She has studied
beginning reading materials, text difficulty,
and struggling readers since 1999. Her
research has appeared in Reading
Research Quarterly, The Educational
Researcher, Elementary School Journal,
and Early Childhood Research Quarterly.
She has written and directed eight grants
aimed at improving reading instruction in K-5



classrooms. Dr. Mesmer is the author of several books including *Letter Lessons and First Words: Phonics Foundations that Work* (Heinemann, 2019), *Alphabetics for Emerging Learners: Building Strong Reading Foundations in PreK* (2021). *Teaching skills for complex text: Deepening reading in the classroom* (Teachers College Press, 2016) Her research has been supported by a National Academy of Education/Spencer Foundation, and an American Educational Research Association/Institute of Education Sciences grant. She is the recipient of the Outreach Award, from the College of Liberal Arts and Human Sciences at Virginia Tech, and the Promising Scholar Award, from the School of Education, Virginia Tech. In 2014, she delivered The George Graham Lecture in Reading at the Curry School of Education, University of Virginia. She is regularly called upon by states and professional organizations to deliver lectures in her area of expertise (e.g., International Literacy Association, State of Maryland)



As Vice President and Chief Academic Officer, **Dr. Gene Kerns** advises educators in both the US and the UK about academic trends and opportunities. Dr. Kerns is a leading authority on education standards in the US and England, learning progressions, formative assessment, personalized learning, and the application of insights from the "science of expertise" within K–12. He delivers highly sought-after presentations each year—often to standing-room-only crowds of educators and administrators. Prior to joining Renaissance: Dr. Kerns served as the Supervisor of

Academic Services for the Milford School District in Delaware, was an adjunct faculty member at the University of Delaware, and held various other teaching and administrative positions in Delaware and Virginia. He received Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Longwood University in Virginia, and holds a Doctor of Education degree from the University of Delaware. He is co-author of two books, inFormative Assessment: When It's Not About a Grade and Unlocking Student Talent: The New Science of Developing Expertise (in press).

Nichols currently holds a Bachelor of Science in Communications from Shepherd College and a Master of Education from West Virginia University. She has taught for 21 years. and she is a mentor teacher for future teachers. 
