One of the goals of the West Virginia Reading Association is to recognize professional educators across the state that have made outstanding contributions in the area of reading literacy.

To accomplish this goal we need these individuals to be nominated by people who see their efforts. Nominated individuals will receive packets to apply for the awards. The award winners, as well as all the nominees who have completed their applications, will be recognized at our annual conference in November.

This year we've added a new award, The Outstanding Future Teacher Award, to recognize and honor those individuals exhibiting excellence as a literacy educator in their undergraduate work.

The Eddie C. Kennedy Award

• ANY certified teacher K-12, across the curriculum, who has made an outstanding contribution to helping students become proficient readers and motivating them to become lifelong readers.

[This award is named in honor of Dr. Eddie C. Kennedy, an inspiring professor at WVU and member of WVRA.]

The Madge McDaniel Award

• An educator or administrator who has made outstanding contributions to the field of reading literacy. This may include, but is not limited to superintendents, principals, supervisors, Title I directors, county language arts coordinators/supervisors, staff development coordinators, and college educators. [This award is named in honor of Madge McDaniel, the first elected president of WVRA.]

The Dr. Jennie Bechtold Award

• A full-time elementary teacher, Title I teacher, or a reading interventionist who has been employed for 1-5 years and has demonstrated excellence in teaching.

[This award is named in honor of Dr Jennie Bechtold whose untiring commitment to WVRA, IRA,

and to her many students was exemplary.]

The Outstanding Future Teacher Award

• A full-time undergraduate student enrolled in a Teacher Education program at a college/university who demonstrates potential and promising qualities as a preservice teacher. This student is making notable progress toward becoming a skilled educator who understands the importance of effective literacy instruction, is dedicated to continuous learning, and aims to foster a passion for reading in their students.

The Cynthia Lorentz-Cook Memorial Grant

• This provides grant money (up to \$1000) to local WVRA reading councils for literacy programs and projects.
